BACHELOR'S PROGRAMME MEDICAL SCIENCE

THE STUDY PROGRAMME

The focus of the training is on the combination of basic knowledge of health and disease and clinical practice. Students at KL are introduced to clinical experience in our University Hospitals starting from the first day of their studies. Theory is taught based on actual case material. Group work enables detailed study of cases (problem-oriented, patient-centered) with review of relevant literature.

DURATION

The Bachelor's programme in Medical Science lasts six semesters (each of which has three modules), and is divided into three consecutive years of study. Each of the three modules lasts 5 weeks. In addition to the core content, students complete one elective module and one elective course. After successful completion of the Preparatory Course, students are required to complete a clerkship accounting for a minimum of 8 ECTS, as well as a scientific paper (thesis) at the level of their Bachelor's programme.

THE LECTURERS

The faculty consists of clinical staff of the University Hospitals Krems, St. Pölten and Tulln, permanent staff of the KL University, as well as external specialists from practice, research and teaching.

THE APPLICATION

The prerequisite for admission to the programme is proof of a general university entrance qualification (school-leaving certificate). The general university entrance qualification can be proven with one of the following certificates:

- School-leaving qualification
- Vocational matriculation certificate
- University entrance qualification examination
- International school-leaving certificate equivalent to an equivalent to the Austrian "Matura"/"Reifeprüfung"

Additional evidence that must be provided for admission to the study programme:

- Biology: Proof of at least one successfully attended weekly lesson in biology after the 8th grade at a secondary school or proof of a supplementary examination in biology according to § 2 UBVO 1998.
- > English: Proof of knowledge of the English language at least on level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR): IELTS (minimum score 6.0), TOEFL (minimum score 87), English-Cambridge 1st Certificate, standardized school-leaving examination in English (Zentralmatura).
- **Latin:** Proof of at least 10 hours per week in Latin at a secondary school. Alternatively, a supplementary Latin examination/Medical Terminology must be taken before the final examination for the Bachelor's degree.



FINANCING

Grants and other financial aid ensure that interested students - regardless of their financial situation - have the opportunity to study at KL.

In addition to the scholarship models of the province of Lower Austria, there are many other support and financing possibilities via public subsidies, foundations, funds and banks.

THE APPLICATION

Karl Landsteiner University of Health Sciences (KL) offers all graduates of the Bachelor's programme in Medical Science at KL the possibility to start the Master's programme in Human Medicine directly (without a new admission procedure), provided that they can prove sufficient knowledge of the German language (level C1 of the CEFR).

In addition, there is the possibility for external students with substantial previous knowledge to apply for a study place in the programme.

Admission to the Master's programme in Human Medicine is based on a standardized interview at the KL and on the basis of available study places. Prerequisite is a successfully completed Bachelor's degree in Medical Science at KL or an equivalent successfully completed degree (min. 180 ECTS). www.kl.ac.at/en/admission

For foreign-language applicants, proof of knowledge of the German language (secondary school certificate, central intermediate level examination of the Goethe-Institut, OESD Mittelstufe Deutsch, certificate of the "Common European Framework of Reference for Languages"/Level C1) is required.
